Enrollment procedure:

- 1. All kindergarten parents, including potential Young 5s, attend kindergarten roundup at their assigned neighborhood school.
- 2. All families complete enrollment paperwork at their assigned school.
- 3. Once parents say they would like to enroll in Young 5s, the following will occur:
 - a. In schools that offer a Young 5s program, the child will be placed on a Young 5s request list. Priority is given to students already assigned to that school.
 - b. In schools that do not offer a Young 5s program, office staff will tell parents of the nearest schools offering the program. If parents are willing to transport their child to the alternate site, the office staff will contact the site to place the child on a request list for that school.
- 4. Starting in early June, schools will reach out to parents on the request list about the child's placement in the program. If a requested school is not available, a slot at another location may be offered to parents.

Young 5s provides children with an opportunity to learn in an enriching and academically challenging environment that nurtures their growth. Research shows that children who attend kindergarten readiness programs like Young 5s are more likely to excel in school and attend college.

Many parents who have recognized the benefits of Young 5s have been enrolling their children in similar programs, public and private, for years. This Young 5s will help all of our children get the best possible start, with a curriculum that is designed just for them.

What happens in a Young 5s classroom?

In Young 5s, teachers help children develop through a thematic, hands-on approach. They expose children to reading, writing and math in an exciting, interactive way to teach children about words and sentences and help them understand mathematical concepts like counting and patterns.
